**This is A Release Of Liability**

The White Mountains 100 is an inherently dangerous wilderness race. Racers will be exposed to environmental and physical conditions that can stress the body to the point of exhaustion. Racers must be self sufficient and have the ability and will to take care of themselves. It is up to each participant to ensure that they have adequate outdoor gear, plenty of food and water, are in top physical shape, and have the mental strength to endure the hardships that may be encountered along the race course. The race will be held on groomed trails with evenly spaced checkpoints in the White Mountains National Recreation Area - **BUT**- this does not imply that conditions along the course will be easy. Racers must be prepared to contend with frostbite, hypothermia, sleep deprivation, extremely cold temperatures, strong winds, blowing snow and whiteouts, overflow, glare ice, ruts in the trail, bumps, dirt and rocks, overhanging trees and branches, blind corners, unexpected obstacles on the trail, steep and narrow descents, getting lost, aggressive wildlife, etc.

I accept and clearly understand that there are risks involved in the activities of this race that include but are not limited to those listed above as well as winter-camping, biking, running, and skiing. I understand that there are more hazards than are enumerated here, and that there are unknown and unforeseeable hazards. I engage in the activity of this race/adventure with knowledge of the inherent risks of injury.

I agree to participate at my own risk. I therefore, myself, my heirs, successors and representatives hereby knowingly and intentionally waive and release, and agree to indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the race organizers and race volunteers, or their estates from any and all liability for any and all such damage, injury to myself or to any other person or property, including travel to and from Fairbanks.

I understand the risks of winter sports such as biking, running, skiing, snowmachining, and winter camping and I have carefully read, understand and voluntarily accept the terms of this waiver and release agreement.
